

**College of Dental Surgeons of Alberta
Hearing Tribunal Decision**

June 16, 2026

IN ACCORDANCE WITH BYLAW 24.5 OF
THE COLLEGE OF DENTAL SURGEONS OF ALBERTA

On April 22, 2026, a Hearing Tribunal of the College of Dental Surgeons of Alberta found Dr. Amer Hussain guilty of unprofessional conduct, and he was sanctioned. A Hearing Tribunal is an independent group of decision makers comprised of two members of the public appointed by the Government of Alberta and two dentists registered in Alberta.

Dr. Hussain admitted that he failed to either appropriately assess and diagnose, or failed to document an appropriate assessment and diagnosis, including with respect to the patient's profile, facial symmetry, overbite, amount of negative overjet, position of the upper and lower midlines, and the status of the patient's temporomandibular joints, as well as the cause of the patient's malocclusion.

Dr. Hussain also admitted that he failed to appropriately diagnose, consider, and/or treatment plan for the patient's ankylosed tooth.

ORDERS OF HEARING TRIBUNAL

The Hearing Tribunal accepted a Joint Submission on Penalty from the parties and issued the following orders on sanction:

1. Dr. Hussain is reprimanded, with the decision of the Hearing Tribunal serving as the reprimand;
2. Dr. Hussain shall pay a fine in the amount of \$3,500 in relation to his failure to either appropriately assess and diagnose or document the same, and a fine of \$2,500 in relation to his failure to appropriately diagnose, consider and/or treatment plan the ankylosed tooth (for a total fine of \$6,000);
3. Dr. Hussain shall engage with a Coach and Mentor; and
4. Dr. Hussain shall pay \$5,000 towards the costs of the investigation and hearing.
